

TOMIHARI ARTWORKS ON DISPLAY 17 AUG - 05 SEP | Old Courthouse Complex

Woodcuts gifted by Hiroshi Tomihari, a highly regarded award-winning artist and National Treasure of Japan. Some of these works are very significant and are also represented in major US & European Galleries.



SISTER CITY MURAL The Bean Chapel

A colourful mural depicting the Sugito Mascot, Sugipyon, on the Busselton Boulevard Shopping Centre in Prince Street, painted by local artist Tom Ansell as part of the 20th Anniversary Celebrations in 2016.



BUSSELTON SUGITO FRIENDSHIP JAPANESE GARDENS Corner Harris Rd, Stanley Place

The Busselton Sugito Friendship Japanese Gardens was gifted to the City of Busselton by the Town of Sugito in 1998. Located next to the City of Busselton library.



SISTER CITY ELM TREE AND PLAQUE

A large Japanese Elm Tree planted in 1997 to mark the start of the Sister City friendship with Sugito. The tree along with a commemorative plaque placed under it are located in the gardens of the City of Busselton Civic and Administration Building.



HIROSHIMA GINGKO TREE

Near the City of Busselton Civic and Administration Building

On World Peace Day and in recognition of the 75th anniversary of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in Japan in 1945, the City of Busselton planted a Ginko Biloba tree in Busselton on 21 September 2020. The young tree was gifted to the City of Busselton by the Mayors for Peace. It was grown from seeds from a 200 year old tree that survived the atomic bombing and subsequent fires in Hiroshima in 1945.

FLOATING LANTERN Festival

16 SEP 3:00 - SUNSET

Join us at the Friendship Park in Queens Garden for an afternoon of healing, as we celebrate hope, harmony and community at the Bunbury Garden Labyrinth.

The sprawling lawns come to life with plum blossom trees, acoustic music, stalls, workshops, Japanese kites, kimono stalls, food, and more.

Venture to Water's Edge cafe for Japanese food and beverages, before assembling at sunset for our journey down to the picturesque estuary to float our lanterns.

DECORATE YOUR OWN LANTERN \$20

Pick up your lantern at the festival and decorate it to your liking! Pre-orders are ESSENTIAL - we cannot guarantee you one otherwise.

KID'S CRAFT WORKSHOPS \$5

There are a series of kids' workshops available with Kite Kinetics (and usually a few lolly drops!).

KIMONOS IN THE PARK GOLD COIN

Walk along the Bunbury Garden Labyrinth.

Pop into Water's Edge Cafe to see what's happening throughout the Floating Lantern Festival!

THE PROCESS

1. Come down to the Gardens any time after 3pm and look for the big white tent with tables in front of it.

2. Show us your ticket for a lantern, and we'll make sure you get the right amount. 3. Decorate your lantern however you like, and bring it back to us to dry.

4. Enjoy the festival!


5. At sunset, come back and collect your lantern. We all gather in a crowd, walk to the estuary and launch together as a community.

Toro Nagashi (Floating Lanterns) can be a smaller family affair to remember lost loved ones, or a much bigger event to bring community and family together. Each year during O-bon, people float their lanterns to guide their visiting ancestoral spirits down to the sea. It is a beautiful time to reflect.


