THE HISTORY OF THE FLOATING LANTERN GEREMONY

Toro Nagashi (Floating Lanterns) can be a smaller family affair to remember lost loved ones, or a much bigger event to bring community and family together.

Each year during O-bon, people float their lanterns to guide their visiting ancestral spirits down to the sea.

YOUR PERFECT SATURDAY ITINERARY

11 AM: come on down to the Bunbury Markets to create a koi kite. Have a go at Taiko drumming in preparation for...

12:30PM: Taiko workshops start at Froth Craft Brewery (booking required).

3PM: Lantern Festival opens at Friendship Gardens with food trucks, photo ops, music and more! Decorate your lantern.

4:30PM: 1920's Japanese jazz themed tour around Bunbury (booking required).

6:15PM/SUNSET: Launch lanterns

7:30: FREE Wasabi Show with Taiko On at Froth Craft Brewery Bunbury.

COMING TO THE FLOATING LANTERN CEREMONY?

- 1. Come down to the Gardens any time between 3pm - 5pm and look for the big white tent with tables in front of it.
- 2. Show us your ticket for a lantern, and we'll make sure you get the right type and amount.
- Decorate your lantern however you like, and bring it back to us to dry and assemble for floating. Wander about the festival!
- At sunset, come back and collect your lantern. We all gather in a crowd, walk to the estuary and launch together as a community.
